





### Rector's Ramblings

### Remember also: you'll never walk alone

ife is a pilgrimage; and whoever or wherever you are, you are on that pilgrimage, that journey. And as we focus this month on the thousands of men and women who have given *their* lives for the sake of *our* lives and our freedom, it's good to remind ourselves that individually, nationally, globally – we are *all* on life's journey.

As those brave young men and women set out to serve their country, most will not have had any idea in which direction their life journey would take them. And many, perhaps, will not have had a 'spiritual blueprint' – a something deeper – with which to sustain and uphold them on their journey.

Stephen Cottrell, the Bishop of Chelmsford, recently spoke of his personal pilgrimage, setting-out to walk from Chelmsford in Essex to Santiago de Compostela, in the far north west of Spain. If that sounds daunting, it is! But Bishop Stephen offered four points to help the aspiring pilgrim — all of which can be applied to our journey of life, and more especially to a journey with God:

- 1. Your journey starts from where you are, wherever that may be; there's no point wishing you were starting from somewhere else. Where you are is fine by God. *Your* journey with God can start today!
- Don't carry too much baggage. Stephen was told to keep his rucksack to 10 kilos, and was very pleased with himself for getting it down to 8 kilos. But it was still too heavy; he was carrying too much. We can all carry too much 'baggage' – worries, busy-ness, stress. Jesus tells us not to worry: God knows our needs (Matthew 6:25ff).
- 3. On the pilgrimage you don't get to choose your companions, so accept and value them for who and what they are. One of the bishop's companions turned out to be an actor who knew the whole of St John's Gospel off by heart all 21 chapters!
- 4. "What if I lose my way?" Someone has been that way/gone that way before you and has blazed a trail; just look for the markers, the way signs.

The most obvious example of one who has gone before us to show us the way is, of course, Jesus Christ, who shares our journey through life. We know, too, that we are 'surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses' (*Hebrews 12:1*) - those whose past lives of faith continue to inspire and encourage us today, as though they were cheering us on as we journey forward.

So, as *you* journey on through the ups and downs of life, remember that you'll never walk alone.



# **GRADE RUAN COMMUNITY TRUST**

In 2007, Grade Ruan Parish Council (PC) arranged a deal with Kerrier District Council whereby responsibility for both Cadgwith car park and the public toilets would be devolved to the PC, so that income from the car park would provide funds to maintain and improve the toilets as well as the car park. The PC in turn devolved responsibility to the Grade Ruan Community Trust (GRCT), which manages the day to day running and maintenance of the Cadgwith car park, and the public toilets at Cadgwith, Kennack and Ruan Minor.

The GRCT is a registered charity with the objective of "the provision, improvement, maintenance and protection of such public amenities in the Parish of Grade Ruan as the Trustees shall from time to time decide, for the benefit of the inhabitants of, and visitors to, the said Parish". Having charitable status means that the Trust pays reduced business rates on the car park and toilet premises.

The current Trustees are: Paul Collins (Chairman), Jonathan Fletcher, Peter Freeman, Moira Hurst (Secretary), Elwyn Jones, Mo Jones (Treasurer), Nicky Jose, Richard Williams.

The ongoing work that the Trust does includes:

- Regular cleaning of 3 sets of toilets
- Emptying the sewerage tank at Kennack
- Emptying the car park ticket machine and banking the money
- Provision of car parking for residents at a nominal rate
- Doing running repairs to toilets, including after frequent vandalism at Kennack
- Litter picking in the car park and on the footpath to Cadgwith
- Liaison with the Friends of Kennack Sands to ensure collaboration on their plans for improving the area
- Mowing the grass verge in the car park and at Treleague
- Annual maintenance at all toilets over the winter
- Dealing with emergencies at any of the toilets, e.g. water leaks, blocked toilets

In addition, one off jobs done recently include:

- Upgrading the Ladies toilets at Cadgwith to the standard to which we aspire for all the toilets
- Altering the car park ticket machine to take the new £1 coins
- Resurfacing the entrance slope to the car park
- Improving signage at the three sets of toilets

cont.

- Printing a new edition of the tourist information leaflet about the Parish (available at the car park and in the Cove)
- Replacement of windows in the Kennack toilets with uPVC

## Current items on the agenda include:

- Waste Collection. The Trust was severely affected by Cornwall Council's decision
  to withdraw all its refuse collection from the car park and from Kennack Sands.
  Notices in both places asking visitors to take their rubbish home with them helped,
  but there are still ongoing problems with dog waste in the car park and rubbish at
  Kennack, which require resolving.
- Electricity at Kennack. Provision of electricity would enable the installation of hand drying machines which would eliminate much of the paper waste created at Kennack.
- Woodland Walk. The Trust plans to create an arch to highlight the start of the woodland walk on the area below the Cadgwith car park. The walk will be signposted and shown on the tourist information leaflet.

If, as has been the case over the last few years, income from the car park exceeds the amount needed for maintenance, then the Trust has the authority to grant funds for local projects that comply with the Trust's objective of "provision, improvement, maintenance and protection of public amenities".

# Gardening in October

by David Endean

Well winter feels as if it is really upon us now. Everything became tatty around the garden early this year and I was looking across the fields today thinking that it

could be any good winter's day really, with the low but bright sun, a gale blowing and hardly a leaf left on the trees. Alas we rarely see much autumnal colours in this part of the peninsula, as there's too much wind.

Once again I have seen many lawn problems this autumn. One of the most annoying is small holes occurring in the lawn sometimes with larger patches of turf being gouged up. The problem is derived from what is under the turf. Often at the end of the summer you will notice small brown patches in the lawn and then the holes appear. I have always said that it is leather jackets eating the roots thus killing patches of turf, then animals coming along and digging searching for them. I know this was a real problem two years ago and even with the rugby pitch at Murrayfield where great areas would rip up as the roots were damaged. This is not the only pest that does this damage - chafer grubs do the same thing. These are ugly inch long brown headed white creatures. I had cause to prepare a fresh new rose bed in a turfed area a few weeks ago and under every spade full of turf was a Chafer grub feasting away. There must have been more than 50 there, and the birds had a field day. These grubs eat the grass root, then birds such as Rooks and crows, and even Green woodpeckers and animals like foxes and badgers come along and rummage around, pulling at the turf to eat the grubs. This leaves you with a real mess. At this time of year there is little that you can do other than rake out the dead thatch and moss, fill the holes and give it a preparatory autumn feed. Because these grubs can persist in the soil for up to 3 years and each year more can be laid, you need to treat the lawn. Chemical treatments have now been lost to the amateur gardener so you have to use an organic treatment of a special nematode which you can get from several companies through mail order, or at the garden centre. These need soil temperatures of above 12°C, therefore they need to be used in August or September to be effective.

There are several deciduous shrubs which I like to prune now: plants like Berberis thunbergii. I do it now because they show some lovely autumn colours which are lost if they are cut back any earlier. When they lose their leaves they are generally dormant and then you can be much harder on the plant. Cut them back to a pleasing shape. Doing it at this time of the year means that you do not notice any bare patches which may occur but they will readily grow in, in the spring. This treatment is ideal for many deciduous trees and shrubs. This means that November is the ideal month to start the winter pruning of fruit trees such as apples and pears. Do not go to town on a mature tree right away as you will be rewarded with little more than lots of soft whippy growth and no fruit next year. Initially go in and remove only dead, diseased and crossing branches. Leave major branch removal to a gradual process in future years. Young trees should be pruned back to encourage spur growth whilst keeping the shape required.

There is little to do in the vegetable garden, other than continuing to harvest crops that you have. Protect any brassicas such as spring greens from the ravages of pigeons by covering them with a net. The net needs to be far enough away from the foliage so that the birds cannot land on it and eat the greens through the mesh. Also the net needs to be far enough away so that the wind does not whip it and damage the plants that you are protecting underneath. When the weather allows and you have free spaces in the veg patch, dig the ground over as this helps to remove weeds, add air to the soil and helps it drain so that you can use the ground earlier in the spring.

What else can you do this month? Well it is your last chance to sow some broad beans and peas to over winter in the garden. Many people will make a sowing of sweet peas in pots now, but I usually leave mine until the early spring. This year I must sow an early batch because I know some people who want the plant in February. These are really hardy and so can be grown on in a cold frame or unheated greenhouse until next spring, but do protect them from mice and slugs.

Whatever you decide needs doing this month enjoy your gardening.




