# **Ruan Minor Surgery**

#### 'Times are changing, look at everything that's come and gone!'

A famous line from Bryan Adams' *Summer of 69* song that sums up so many of the County's towns and villages. It's Human nature to want to 'progress' and 'evolve' but at what cost to the local community? Ruan Minor is a friendly village where the local residents not only support their neighbours and friends but equally support their local school, shops, businesses, public transport, churches, village hall and their **Doctors Surgery**.

As you are probably aware Ruan Minor surgery is part of a larger Group Practice comprising of Mullion Health Centre, Constantine Surgery and Lizard Surgery. Three of the four sites have their own in-house dispensary where prescriptions are provided from our Doctors for our patients. I'm sure you will agree this is a real asset to those villages. Providing prescribed medications to our patients ensures that the medication is up to date (i.e. current and accurate as per the Doctor's latest instructions). Prescriptions can be intercepted and changed if the Doctor makes amendments to the drugs or dosing. We are well stocked and have most commonly prescribed medications on the shelf; however, if we don't have a particular item we will endeavour to obtain it within a few days.

You may have received a leaflet in the post inviting you to get your repeat prescriptions from an online provider called Pharmacy2U. Pharmacy2U is not your local Pharmacy and has nothing to do with local pharmacies and dispensing surgeries. We feel you should be aware of some facts regarding Pharmacy2U.

- There is no face-to-face contact they are only allowed to deal with patients by post, or telephone.
- In 2015 Pharmacy2U was fined for selling its patients' details. The Information Commissioners Office found that data was used to deliberately target elderly and vulnerable patients.
- Over Christmas 2015, Pharmacy2U failed to send out prescriptions, leaving thousands of patients without their essential medicines.
- In 2017 the Care Quality Commission (CQC) inspected Pharmacy2U and deemed it '**not safe**, effective or well led'. In comparison Mullion & Constantine Group Practice were recently awarded '**Outstanding**' by the CQC and rated the top Surgery Group in Cornwall.

We urge you to continue to support us and allow us to care for you and your family by ignoring requests from internet providers like Pharmacy2U and continuing to obtain your prescriptions from your local NHS Doctors Surgery Dispensary. Don't let us become another statistic of what there **used** to be in the village

#### Grade Ruan singers at The Lizard

Local singers Angela Agutter-Thomas, Jane Edgerley, Alison Goldsack, Mark Outten and Pat Palmer can lay claim to participating in mainland UK's most southerly candlelit Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols in 2018 which took place at St Wynwallow Church at Landewednack. (Sadly Sally Ellis was unable to attend the service due to illness.)

This is the fourth consecutive year that An Lysardh Christmas Choir, comprising singers from across the Lizard Peninsula plus a few vocalists from Helston, has come together with previous carol services being held at Trelowarren, Gunwalloe and Mawgan. An Lysardh, conducted and directed by Andrew Woods, has built up a reputation for its rendition of both traditional and modern Christmas music, and St Wynwallow was full with the congregation coming from as far as Penzance and Penryn. A particular highlight was *I sing of a maiden* by Robin Wells which was both moving and magical to listen to. The congregation joined in the traditional carols such as *Once in royal David's city* with Jacquie Griffiths singing the first verse solo. Charlotte Massey was the soloist in *Of the Father's heart begotten* and the first verse

of *I sing of a maiden*. Ann Bradbury, organist at St Wynwallow, accompanied the choir both on the organ and keyboard as well as playing the flute.

The church bells were rung before and after the service which was led by the Reverend Peter Sharpe who also read one of the lessons, along with members of the choir including Alison Goldsack, and the congregation including Mike Lord representing The Bolenowe Animal Sanctuary. A collection of over £300 was taken which is being shared equally between The Bolenowe Animal Sanctuary and St Wynwallow Church. Following the service, mulled wine and mince pies were served to the congregation.

Andrew would like to thank all those people who kindly responded to his plea for glass dishes to put tea lights in. Over 300 candles were used at St Wynwallow.

As the Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols service is proving so popular on the Lizard, Andrew is already making plans for the 2019 service at a yet to be revealed location!

March. We will open about half-hour before kick-off of the first match and close about an hour after the last match ends each day.

- If we get a repeat of last year's weather we will open on any "snow day", probably from 1pm to 7pm!

Whilst all that is going on, we are - at last! proceeding with the next phase of the kitchen fitting out. Next week (as I write) we will have some electrical alterations done, stainless steel cladding fitted around the cooking area, the extraction hood properly installed with ducting through the wall and safety system, and finally the gas for the cooker connected up and signed-off. We're still a way off being able to serve hot food on a commercial basis, but at least groups using the building can use the kitchen to heat food and snacks for their own consumption.

We do seem to be accumulating rather a lot of "lost property"! There are a number of coats, etc. that have been hanging in the corridor for many months now, also two pairs of shoes. There's also a box in one of the sheds containing stuff from the first couple of years of opening. I'll post (probably already done by the time you read this!) some photos on facebook. We have anything decided that that remains unclaimed after a couple more months will be donated to one of the local charity shops (probably the Fisherman's Mission) - so if you are missing something, please get in touch soon!

#### **Rector's Ramblings** Church - what does it mean to you?

guess it means different things to all of us; a building, a group of people we feel part of, an institution. It may mean something special because of a personal association: where you were married; where your family are buried; a place to go when you need some space alone. For some, it may have negative associations, through a time when you were hurt, or through negative press.

For our communities, one of the things Church speaks of is 'community', and especially a connection with our roots. Church seems to be one thing that never changes. The stones are often ancient and speak of the generations who have gathered there. Most of our churches are open, and people go there for a sense of something grounded, something unchanging and 'other'.

Except, of course, our churches *do* change; at one time pews and the organ were new-fangled inventions; there was no heating. And, of course, every church had its own Vicar. And, at one time, everyone went there every Sunday; some singing in the choir. Maybe they changed, but they always changed slowly. For most of their history, churches have simply been there. Church was something assumed, provided, something you could go to.

Of course, for some, Church has always been something greater than the building: a special community of faith; the body of Christ expressed in a human family and community. But even this has had a sense of something that has always been there; something available for you to join; something provided for you to help you grow in faith and worship.

When something is just there (as it always has been), something provided, something always available, people don't often think about what it is, or what it should be. The only question is whether you want to engage with it, what it might do for you.

But, now, we do need to think about what Church is, what it means to us. As congregations age and get smaller, the upkeep of our buildings becomes much harder. Vicars, also, need to be paid, and there are less of them to go around. We are moving from a time when Church was provided to us (for us to use as and when we needed). Increasingly, Church is going to become whatever we all are willing to make it be.

Already some communities have set up Friends groups to support the maintenance of their church buildings. But the buildings lose their meaning if they are not places of regular worship, gathering places for the true Church – the people God has called to him by faith in Jesus Christ.

I believe that Church (the people and the buildings) are important, something that God wants to build with those who are willing to join with him. But, there's the rub.

It is time for a serious conversation. What does Church mean to you? What do you want it to be? What are you willing to make it?

#### LIZARD LIFEBOAT - VISITOR CENTRE NEWS By David Gascoigne, Visitor Centre Manager

#### **HAPPY NEW YEAR**

The Visitor Centre Team had to cope with a few unavoidable difficulties in 2018. Atrocious weather at the start of the year, two heavy (for the Lizard) snowfalls and essential maintenance work to the station and the cliff face caused a significant reduction in available opening hours. More bad weather at other times during the year meant that key events were affected but we were not, of course, alone with those problems. Fortunes were mixed. The Lizard Vintage Rally had yet another awful day and Lizard Carnival Fun Day had its share of the 'wet stuff' whereas the Grade Ruan Vintage Rally enjoyed their best day for some time!

That said, amazingly, visitor numbers were 500 or so up on 2017 with over 7,000 visits formally recorded through the Station doors. Only visitor numbers we can be certain of are formally recorded. Events such as Lifeboat Day, October AGM Open Day and the annual Carolaire have many more visitors than we can accurately count so those visits are not included in our figures. Visitors attending a number of 'formal' and school visits also cannot be quantified precisely and are not included but, all in all, the Centre Team provided a welcoming smile and assistance to approximately 8,500 people making their visits as pleasant and interesting as possible. A mammoth achievement indeed. Visitors arrive at Kilcobben Cove from all parts of the UK and from all over the world. In 2017 we welcomed visitors from 22 different countries. In 2018 we added to this with visitors from 7 countries not previously represented. These were:

The 22<sup>nd</sup> January this year saw the 160<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the tragic sinking of the SS CZAR on the Vrogue Rock, Bass Point, Lizard. The CZAR Captain (Captain Robert Jackson) was en route to Malta with his ship laden with a valuable cargo of arms, munitions and other military stores when either her engines or her boilers (it is not clear which) began to give trouble. The Captain decided to turn about and make for Falmouth but during the procedure came too close to land and fell foul of the infamous Vrogue Rock resulting in Captain Jackson, his wife and child and 10 crew losing their lives. Although founded in 1824, there was no RNLI presence on this part of the coast at that time but the heroic efforts of local coastguard John Ridge and local boatmen saved the lives of the remaining 18 crew members.

The tragedy had a profound effect on the local community. In particular, the Agar Robartes family of Lanhydrock were so moved that members donated the monies required to provide the first Lizard Lifeboat, Anna Maria (named after Mrs Agar Robartes) and a boathouse for her atop Lizard Point. This first Lizard Lifeboat and

Boathouse became operational in November 1859 and other stations were founded along the coast over the following few years giving RNLI support to local shipping for the first time.

# Gardening in February

by David Endean

Happy New Year. Gardening is a circle with no beginning nor end, but the days are getting appreciably longer now and there are a few signs of

spring and thoughts go to sowing a few seeds and seeing new life emerge.

What have I got planned for February? Firstly it will be sowing my Sweet Pea seeds. I will pre-chit these on damp tissue paper in a warm spot, then pot them individually so I will need at least 400 pots this will give me plenty of choice to pick the best strongest plants as the season goes on. One thing for sure when these get put in the greenhouse plenty of mouse traps will be in evidence to protect my seedlings. Mice played havoc last year with my second and third sowings of Broad beans. They can be sown now in pots in the greenhouse. At this time of year the greenhouse is the place to be. Firstly clear all the junk and detritus out and wash it down with Jeyes fluid. This kills lots of bugs and spores and cleans the glass, as getting as much light to your plants at this time of year is essential. Wash anything and everything that you put back in the greenhouse and if you can treat the greenhouse with either a sulphur candle (not if you have any plants in there) or an insecticide smoke bomb. All this prep will not eradicate problems but will vastly reduce the probability of getting any.

If you plan to sow some seeds, invest in some good quality sterilised seed compost. This is often more difficult to find, as usually you see a multipurpose type. A good quality version of this is fine but I would sieve it so that it is not too coarse, plus add a little silver sand, to keep the medium open. Keep the bag of compost in the greenhouse to warm up a little before you use it and when buying compost do not bother with a bag which is wet and heavy. It has probably been hanging around for a long while and the best of the nutrients will have leached out if not other contaminants got in. Keep a bucket of water in the greenhouse so that it gets to an ambient temperature and use tap water rather than that from your water butts as there will be far fewer microbes in it to cause problems when your seed does germinate.

What other seed will I sow this month? I plan to sow the first lettuce, pointed cabbage, onions and leeks, plus perhaps some parsley. I found some fancy foxglove seed that I will give a go and was given some chilli pepper seed plus some seed from a mystery plant. I could sow begonias, lobelia, antirrhinums to name a few but I am going to let somebody else do the work and I will buy them in as plug plants. I am aiming early on to grow things which

do not need too much heat as this is expensive to produce. My only means of heating is via a Paraffin heater and at  $\pounds$ 7 a gallon this soon mounts up.

Outside in the veg patch, get on with digging the ground and if your ground is dry enough possibly plant out some onion sets and shallots, they will appreciate it if you add plenty of well-rotted manure. Also tidy up around your rhubarb crowns: remove any debris and weeds, fork over very lightly, add some fertiliser and more of the well-rotted good stuff. Good garden hygiene is going to become more vital as the use of Metaldehyde slug pellets will be phased out over the next 18 months and expect them to disappear from the shelves within six months.

If you have not done so already, cut off the old leaves of your hellebores so the fresh young flower shoots and leaves will look smart and unhindered. Whilst in your flower borders, hoe off any fresh weed seedlings which have germinated during that warm spell around Christmas. But be careful of any bulbs which are now poking their heads up through the soil hoping to be ready for the Spring show.

Well get out there and enjoy your gardening. Think back to last year when we had snow in February and March!
