From Julie Oldfield:

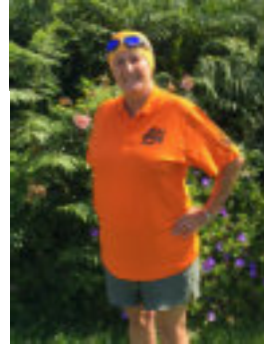

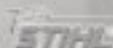

Helen Holyer

30th August 1950 - 19th June 2021

Helen is remembered so much for her lovely smile and the laughter which surrounded her....

She was born, Helen Nancy Jackson, on Wednesday 30th August 1950 in Lordwood, Birmingham to Tom and Flora Jackson, who were both professional nurses.

Raised with her brother David, sister Angela and a half brother Ben in Birmingham, on leaving school at 15 she worked for a while as a telephonist and by the time she was 29 she had moved to the South West to live in Plymouth. With her first husband, Vaughan she was blessed with a daughter, Sarah and after the couple separated in 1984 she met Paul in the late 1980's and her son Tom was born.

By this time Helen was fostering children on a full-time basis and in 1991 she moved to Landreath and five years later she started work as a teaching assistant in Liskeard. In 1998 Paul and Helen decided to go their separate ways, at which point Helen reached a crossroads which would for ever change her life and those of so many others.

Helen became a Mobility and Mobility Orientation Officer and obtaining a Diploma from Birmingham University she became dedicated to helping the visually impaired. And that was when she was to meet Steve in a professional capacity which became very much a personal one!

In a moment I will let Steve speak for himself as I read his tribute to Helen; suffice to say that the next fifteen years would be the happiest for them both. Eventually moving to the wonderful setting of Cadgwith, where Steve was raised, in 2014 Helen left the employ of Cornwall County Council and to all intents and purposes she formally retired. Except she didn't.

The best was certainly to come, because it was in that year that Helen established a business which was destined to benefit millions. Attending a new business course she formed a successful association with Sellelectronics in Falmouth and together they have created a revolutionary system for those with sight impairment. The 'Room Mate' provides sound instructions in various facilities so that where everything is situated in the room becomes crystal clear and having travelled around the country to demonstrate its innovative benefits, it can now be found in hospitals, doctor's surgeries and other important locations across the UK.

It has generated customer service awards for excellence and for Helen to have achieved so much in such a relatively short time is really quite remarkable.

But then Helen was a remarkable woman. And it is at this point that I should read to you what Steve has written about Helen....

"I met Helen 15 years ago when she lived in Liskeard. We soon became a couple and she decided to sell her house and move down to Cadgwith where I grew up. We managed to buy a property together and I feel she was very quickly accepted by the community, one friend telling her that she had 'slotted in' nicely. She soon learned to master the controls on my boat and we often went fishing together.

We were married in Cyprus on Valentine's Day 2017.

We had a very active life together and never argued; not only was she my eyes, she was my rock and my soulmate and I feel privileged to have known her.

Not only did we go abroad together many times, mainly to Cyprus, in the winter, but she also accompanied me to the Scilly's for the annual World Gig Championships, where I rowed with the Cornwall blind crew.

She also assisted in my success in the Annual Conger Fishing Championships, where she was the only female on board, but she took all this in her stride. I believe her "Room Mate" invention should be viewed as her defining epitaph."

Helen's cleverness and her personal brilliance has been reflected in her caring nature which was instinctive to her. From the time when she was fostering children, to her work with the visually impaired, her warmth and concern for others shone through all of her actions. Not content with serving she went one huge inventive step further, when most would have been content to simply retire and take it easy, and that personal 'drive' to help others in a practical way will stand as an example to others for years to come.

She loved her family. Her children were precious to her and she adored her granddaughter Flora.

Strong, brave and determined, her persistence was undoubtedly forged out of the time when at just 20 she lost her mother, Flora, with whom she was known to be close and after that Helen never gave up.

As swift and as terrible as is her passing, you can at least know that for Helen the years now 'will not condemn' and she has left you as bright and as cheerful as when you last saw her. And so she will remain, for each one of you.

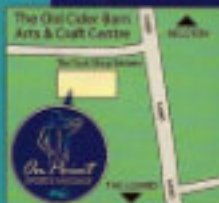

As previously reported we are prioritising our fund raising targets in order to safeguard the church as soon as possible.

The first step is to raise £100,000 which will cover the cost of replacing the roof of the church and ensure that the main building doesn't deteriorate further.

As we have already raised over 30% of £100,000 by separating our work into

phases we are in a position to apply to those requiring 30% of the target and are only £20,000 away from being able to approach the larger number of grant providers who require 50% of the funding in place first. Bumper Summer issue Gazette, and loads going on, so I'll try to fit it all into my allotted page!

The Pavilion Bar continues to be open every Friday and Saturday evening from 5pm. With the glorious weather recently we've had some busy evenings. We've also been open for the Euro 2020 football matches (the ones where England were playing, at least), and, especially the last rounds, we have been packed out. Unfortunately the attempt to use the the big projection screen loaned by Claire from the shop failed as it was impractical to get the picture bright enough to see outside!

In the light of the recent lifting of Covid restrictions, we have been considering how we should proceed. We are well aware that despite the lifted restrictions the virus is still rife and cases are increasing locally - although still, thankfully, rare within our own community. We have decided that for the safety of our staff and our patrons we will continue to operate with the same measures in place - at least until the situation shows signs of improving. So, we will continue to work with table service wherever possible. On

busy events we will probably have a one-way system in place, and a "pop-up" outdoor bar. We plan to get a second card terminal - so we can accept card payments outside. The forthcoming cricket games and live music nights will be opportunity to test out the new systems!

We held our AGM recently (thank you Moira for stretching the Gazette deadline to after the meeting!), and are pleased there were no major changes in membership or officers - Gwen Scolding and I are the Parish Council representatives, Danny Hickey for the Football Club and Jake Scolding, Emma Trewin, Paul Dunmall and Sally Watts elected from the public. Jake is Chairman, Emma Vice-Chairman and I'm Secretary and Treasurer. We find ourselves in a stronger financial position than we have been for a long time. The various Covid grants that we received last year have been a big help, but we were also able to reduce our running costs to a bare minimum by switching off non-essential services during times of lockdown. Up until now, we have not been in a position to set aside any reserves, but now we are setting aside two reserve funds - the first is a fund for the future replacement and maintenance of the BBQ, then

to keep enough funds in reserve to survive for 6-12 months without income.

Further improvements we have planned include adding a commercial fryer, griddle and under-counter fridge and freezer - so we can start providing hot snacks on football match days and other occasions. We are also looking into getting some more tables, preferably ones that can be stacked out of the way when not needed.

You may have noticed six shiny new picnic tables on the Recreation Ground recently - 3 were purchased by the Parish Council to be placed around the play area, and 3 were purchased by ourselves as additional seating in front of the Pavilion.

Before I finish, there is one matter about which we keep getting complaints - the amount of "dog fouling" on the field. I know that most dog-owners are responsible and clear up after their pets, but a small minority don't! There are suitable waste bins at both the main entrances to the field, and notices that explain that it is an offence to allow your dog to foul a public recreation ground - so really no excuse. We are monitoring the situation and will consider a complete ban on dogs on the field if people do not show more consideration!

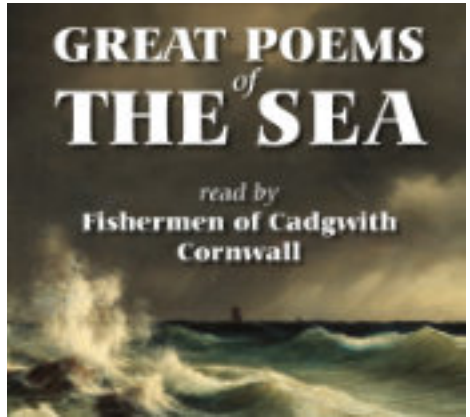

Cadgwith Fishermen record Great Poems of the Sea

Fishermen from Cadgwith Cove have recorded a CD *Great Poems of the Sea read by Fishermen of Cadgwith, Cornwall* in support of the Fishermen's Mission; the great writings of the sea recorded by men who have spent their lives fishing the forbidding waters around the Lizard Peninsula. Poems by the great poets Tennyson, Masfield, Kipling and Longfellow, together with excerpts from Melville's *Moby Dick* and Darwin's *The Voyage of the Beagle*: all read by Cadgwith covemen Steve Collins, Nigel Legge, John Trewin, Plugger Jane, Luke Stephens, Martin Ellis and Jonathan Fletcher.



‘These are men more used to standing with salt in their hair and teeth on the deck of a crabber rather than standing in front of a microphone reading lines of poetry’, said producer Robin Bates, ‘but what you’ll hear are authentic voices of men who know first-hand what the poets write about. In a way, the 21 tracks of the CD are a retort to the current fashion for recording sea shanties - often sung by singers who have never been to sea *. For the men on this CD – it’s a way of life.’

Local musicians provide incidental music between the readings and the CD carries four songs, all original. *Two Men*, written and performed by Paul Collins tells of two Cadgwith fishermen lost in 1994 when their boat sank in Kennack Bay. The song reflects the disparity between domestic life ashore and the perils of life at sea. The Fishermen's Mission supported the families of both fishermen through their grief and loss and is spoken of with great gratitude and respect in the Cadgwith fishing community. Profits from sales of the CD are going to support the Mission's continuing work.

The CD, presented in a booklet-style sleeve designed by Serpentine Design of Cadgwith, is currently on sale for £10 in Cadgwith at The Crows Nest and the Cadgwith Cove Inn, in Ruan Minor Stores, The Fishermen's Mission in Helston or via email at seapoemscadgwith@gmail.com.

THE LIZARD LIFEBOAT VISITOR CENTRE NEWS

2020 – A YEAR LIKE NO OTHER

In common with all charitable operations, the global health crisis had a huge impact on RNLI operations in 2020. Lockdown restrictions disrupted many of our usual activities, including fundraising, crew training, lifeguard roll out, building new lifeboats and station improvements. However, thanks to the selflessness and adaptability of all volunteer and staff members of TEAM RNLI, lifesaving continued throughout the year and continues in the same vein in 2021. Staff and volunteers were required to adjust to new Covid-19 safe procedures and the wearing of extra protective equipment as well as some staff working from home or being placed on furlough. TEAM LIZARD has played its part admirably and, under the leadership and guidance of Coxswain Dan and LOM Ned, has set the highest of operational standards throughout these difficult times.

The demand on RNLI crews and lifeguards continues to increase and people need their help now more than ever. Although the construction and maintenance of lifeboats and stations has been severely curtailed and crew training paused, operational activity has been continued at the highest level possible. In 2020, the RNLI continued to operate:

The Lizard RNLI Lifeboat Station

Recent "Shouts"

21.6.21 - An early start and a very long day for the crew of The Lizard Lifeboat as their pagers sounded a 04.07am on Monday 21st June. After receiving a mayday call, Falmouth Coastguard tasked the lifeboat to go to the assistance of a stricken sailing vessel in a position of 32 nautical miles south east of the station at Kilcobben Cove. With 2 people on board the vessel had lost the use of its rudder and mainsail and were drifting precariously. Fishing Protection vessel "Ocean Osprey" was 6 nautical miles away from the yacht and proceeded to its position to standby until the lifeboat arrived over an hour later. Conditions on scene were described as poor and after ascertaining that the rudder on the vessel was fouled and it would also be unable to sail, a decision was taken to attach a tow line to guide the yacht to the nearest safe and suitable port. Under the command of Coxswain Dan Atkinson and after a long and careful tow RNLB Rose arrived in Falmouth Harbour just over 7 hours later. The lifeboat arrived back at her station at around 17.00pm that afternoon after over 10 hours at sea.

10.7.21 - The Lizard RNLI Lifeboat launched on service on Saturday 10th July following a pager alert at 09.08am to go to the assistance of a yacht with a fouled prop 3 nautical miles East of the station. With 6 people on board, the yacht which was on passage from the Helford to the Isles of Scilly had a rope entangled around its prop disabling it from sailing. Upon arrival on scene the lifeboat deployed its smaller Y-boat and with two crew members on board the rope was safely removed. A tow rope was then attached to the yacht and the lifeboat towed it a short distance before it was ascertained that it would be able to proceed unassisted. On their return to the station the lifeboat was diverted to rocks in the area of Bass Point to go to the aid of a group of people coasteering the coastline. One of the party was exhausted and unable to proceed with the activity. Again the smaller Y-boat was deployed from the lifeboat and the casualty who required no medical attention was taken back to the station to be collected from there. RNLB Rose had rehoused shortly before 11.15am.

16.7.21 - Our crew were paged at 12.44pm on Friday 16th July to reports of an injured casualty requiring medical attention on rocks in the area of Bass Point. The casualty had suffered an ankle injury whilst taking part in a coasteering activity. Upon arrival on scene RNLB Rose stood by until it was ascertained that the Coastguard helicopter 924 would transfer the casualty from the rocks to The Lizard football field in the village where a vehicle would be waiting to transfer the casualty to hospital. Also in attendance was the Mullion Coastguard Rescue Team. The lifeboat returned to station shortly before 2pm.

Despite the current restrictions, RNLB Rose and her crews are on call as usual 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and normal service will always be the order of the day.

Gardening in August and September

by David Endean

What a time of it we are having. It is certainly not too dry - proper growing weather. This is the same for our precious beauties as well as the weeds which are certainly taking advantage of it.

Firstly, keep on top of those weeds. These are mainly tidying months. Dig out perennial weeds and hoe off anything small which germinates. Take advantage of the hot sunshine when it appears and use the hoe, the sun should then kill those weeds which have been uprooted and cut off. Also in the borders do some dead heading to encourage another flush of flowers. Most of your hardy geraniums or cranesbills will have finished flowering and these can be cut off hard. Get some shears or secateurs and reduce them to what is basically a clump of leaf stalks resembling horticultural hedgehogs. This reduces their sprawling habit and within a couple of weeks they will be a tidy mound of fresh leaves

often giving another flush of flowers in the autumn. Aquilegias or columbines can also be treated similarly; they are less likely to repeat flower but it does tidy up the old leaves which often suffer from leaf miner and fungal diseases.

Please keep up the watering of your tubs and baskets I mention it every year but the rain that falls is rarely enough, and once the compost dries out it is really hard to get it to saturate and retain the water without it running right through. Often the plants in your tubs are annuals and if allowed to set seed they think that their job is done so they give up and die. You can prolong their flowering by removing the spent flowers. You can do this as you water - a few minutes each time keeps things looking good. Also regular feeding helps out, as a weekly liquid feed is often best, something like Miracle Gro mixed in the watering can.

Hedges are growing well and like most things in life, little and often is best when it comes to trimming, doing this will keep it looking neat and compact. Down here most hedges seem to grow all year round but try to time it so that your last trimming of leylandii type hedges is somewhere around mid- September. This will give it some time to recover but also toughen up before the winter salt laden winds return to burn the foliage. Later trimming could well lead to the hedge burning.

In the vegetable garden harvesting will now be well under way. Keep picking the beans of all types regularly so they remain young fresh and tender. The same goes for the salad crops at this time of year, as with hot dry times these crops tend to bolt after a thunder storm. The extra moisture makes them think that it is now or never to reproduce and set seed. It is generally too late to sow lettuce seed now to mature outdoors but it is still worth sowing some seed to harvest as just young fresh leaves. With protection this can almost happen all year round. Back to sowing and planting. Try out some winter brassicas, things like spring greens can be sown either direct or in modules and in general winter brassicas suffer fewer pest problems, but pigeons seem to always be a problem. Netting your cabbages is the only real solution. You can probably still find some other brassica plants in the garden centres if you're quick and you could sow some kohlrabi and garden turnips.

Autumn catalogues are popping through the door now and garden centres are having their autumn bulb stocks in, so if you want a bit of fresh colour this spring it may well be worth either ordering or buying some new spring bulbs be it daffodils, crocus or tulips. These can be planted as soon as you get them if you have the space but they will not hurt if you wait until later in the autumn. Just store the bulbs in a cool dry place away from mice and do not forget where you have put them.

Well I hope that you enjoy your gardening.
