Rector's Ramblings

Fake news

his saying has been very much in the news lately and has been highlighted by a person with heavily sprayed, dyed blonde hair and whose name has a relationship with a card game called 'whist'; and, oh yes, he lives in America!!

Fake news and news that is hard to believe has been around for centuries. In the Bible, Eve was given fake news by the devil, (Genesis 3:4). In John's Gospel, one of the twelve disciples, Thomas, was convinced that he was given fake news. His friends told him that Jesus was alive! Thomas thought, "How is that true, the Romans crucified him on a cross?" He said to his friends, "Unless I see the nail marks in his hands and put my finger where the nails were, and put my hand into his side, I will not believe it." (John 20:25)

Like Thomas, it is natural that we want to see before we believe. Many people don't believe in God, or that Jesus rose from the dead, or believe the truth in the Bible. 



The Socoa Ship Wreck



By Debbie Collins

Looking out to sea this morning the wind was blowing quite hard and there was a thick haze over the sea and my mind became drawn to the history of this coast with the many shipwrecks.

You could say one of the causes is the order "To the Lizard for orders". Before the days of radio, the only contact owners had with their ships

was when the ship came within sight of land and was able to send a signal to a shore station. Ships coming home to Britain would sail close to The Lizard in order to contact their owners via Lloyds Signal Station. In poor visibility the ships would get close in to be able to see the signal station in the gloom, sometimes with disastrous results.

One of the most memorable shipwrecks was the Socoa.

Socoa was a French full-rigged steel ship built at Chantiers de St. Nazaire in 1901. Tonnage: 2613 tons. On the 2nd August 1906, she was on a voyage from Stettin to San Francisco with a cargo of cement for the rebuilding after the famous earthquake, when she was stranded off Kildown Point, just outside Cadgwith in dense fog. She was re-floated after jettisoning 50,000 barrels of cement and beached in Cadgwith Cove. If you know where to look, you can still see the barrels on the seabed.

Previously printed in the Grade Ruan Gazette in June 1990 Written by the late John Bourne

On April 29, Cadgwith's new Pilot Gig, the Socoa, was named in the Cove. The star of the ceremony was Annie Moor, the mother of John, the builder of the boat. She sprinkled the champagne and gave the traditional blessing. Later, the Gig club was very touched by Annie's gifts - not only of £25 for the boat, but of a cake stand bearing Socoa's name as "a trophy to be awarded for gig racing". The porcelain stand came from the original Socoa and was given to Annie by her grandfather, Henry Jane. He received it for helping to float the French ship off the shoal where she grounded just north of the Cove in 1906.

Henry was bowman of the Cadgwith Lifeboat, Minnie Moon.

Many visitors, and even a few locals, have asked why the new gig should be named after the ship Socoa. Socoa was the most popular choice when the vote was taken at a general meeting of the Club. The reason is the link between the ship and the





late Buller Arthur, who inspired the renaissance of gig rowing by Cadgwith men at Newquay races after the Second World War. When Harry Arthur, Buller's older brother, was a young man, he painted a picture of the Socoa on the central window embrasure of the Arthur family's home, which is still called Ship Cottage. Harry was killed in the First World War, when he was in the Navy and his anti-submarine netting boat was shelled by an Austrian cruiser in the Adriatic. Afterwards, Buller faithfully re-touched the painting whenever the weather got to it, until his death in 1982. The picture was then covered over. The present picture of the Socoa in the embrasure was painted by [the late] Tony Culmer, a great nephew of Buller, who used

to do a bit of coxing for the Gig club. Steve Collins, the Club's chairman, is another great nephew

Gardening in June

by David Endean

Well how many of you got caught out by that cold snap at the end of April? it was a true blackthorn winter. Just as the blackthorn blossoms were at their peak we had a frosty snap, it got down 1.8 °C in my heated greenhouse! I saw a few frost in patches on grass but saw and heard of the damage on other things. Rows of potatoes even under fleece being damaged, I saw all the young dahlia shoots blackened and even more unusually all the young growth on an ivy bush cut right back. We all get complacent and push the boundaries to get a head start, even the vineyards are reporting the likelihood of a reduced crop this year due to frost damage and so less of the falling over water for you all.

Now is the time to prune the later spring flowering shrubs. The reason for this is that they tend to flower on wood that has been produced the previous year. If you do not reduce the shrubs in size they will get ever bigger. Plants that I am thinking of are Weigelias, Deutzias and Philidelphus. It is not too late to prune Forsythias and flowering currants but they should have been done before now so get on with it quickly. I like to remove all the flowered wood, then shape the bush nicely.

Another plant to have a go at is the *Clematis Montana* once it has finished flowering cut it back to a tight framework because this is a rampant grower and will take over if left to its own devices but like the previous shrubs it needs mature woody stems to produce the masses of spring flowers that it does and what a nice scent it has also, almondy like a good Bakewell tart.

Your roses could probably do with another feed by now, a sprinkling of a proprietary rose fertiliser is best. This is high in potash so promotes flowering and hardens up the woody stems. This is good for most of your flowering plants in the garden but if you do not have enough a sprinkling of the good balanced fish, blood and bone will give a good result. Keep dead heading the roses and remove diseased leaves, a well fed strong growing plant is far less likely to suffer from disease problems.

Your tomato plants should be growing away well by now and it is likely that your first truss of blooms have set and so now is the time to start to regularly use a

dedicated tomato fertiliser such as Tomorite as per its instructions. twice a week is best here. The lawns are often neglected because people think that they will need to cut the grass more often if they fertilise it, which is true but it will reward you with a greener sward which will out compete general lawn weeds and moss better.

A lawn weed and feed is the easiest thing to administer but the experts say that it is best to apply separate lawn weed/moss killers and fertilisers. At this time of year use a high nitrogen fertiliser but if nothing else is at hand use Growmore as this is fast acting. Do not apply them during a long dry spell do the job just before or during some rain being the ideal.

Your tomato plants should be growing away well by now and it is likely that your first truss of blooms have set and so now is the time to start to regularly use a dedicated tomato fertiliser such as Tomorite as per its instructions. Keep your plants well supported, tie in regularly and remove the side-shoots from the leaf axils. This allows more air and light around the plant and so will reduce the risk of disease problems and aid the fruit ripening later in the season.

Keep a close eye on the watering, an established plant requires a pint of water per day plus a pint for every truss of fruit it has on it. So in the peak of the season that is the best part of a gallon per plant, this is obviously dependent on how sunny the day is. It is always best to water first thing in the morning and directly to the roots, not all over the plant as this can lead to sun scorching and fungal problems. By watering in the evening you tend to cool the plants down more than necessary and damp air is created around the plants which remains all night.

Down in the veg patch sow some more beans, be they runners or French types they will motor away with the warmer temperatures. Salad crops are a must and to keep the taste of summer going you should be harvesting the first of your lettuces now and with good planning you should still be harvesting from outdoors well into October and beyond. Your salads can go in where you have just lifted the first of your early potatoes or perhaps plant some leek plant there?

Well I am off now to sort out my Dahlias and tie in all those Sweetpeas and get the hoe out on those sunny days. Enjoy your gardening.
