
Grade Ruan Autumn Show

The Parish Council has a sum of money that can only be spent on affordable housing in the parish. It has decided to set up a Community Land Trust to permanently review the provision of housing for parishioners and to make sure that such houses remain affordable whatever the housing market does.

The Trust will be not-for-profit, run by a small Board of about 6 people, elected each year by the members, and everyone in the parish will be entitled to be a member provided they agree with the objectives of the Trust.

An open public meeting is planned in the Village Hall on Tuesday 15th October at 7.30pm. Councillors will explain all the details and invite your views and suggestions, so please note the date in your diary. There will be a reminder in the October Gazette.



#### CADGWITH COVE GRAND FISHING CONTEST UPDATE


Six competitions in and things are hotting up on the old (actually, new!) leaderboard down the Cove!

### Rector's Ramblings

omething extraordinary happens to Year 6 children in the second half of the school Summer Term in our primary schools. They come back from the half term holiday having grown, it seems, by about a foot! So that by the end of July, and then as the summer holidays draw to a close, they really look like the secondary school students that they will become at the beginning of September, ready in stature at least to take on the challenges and chances of their next step in their education.

In the Church year we are now in 'Ordinary Time' – such a boring and dull name for the period from the day after Pentecost (end of May-ish) to Advent Sunday (end of November-ish).

Because 'Ordinary Time', far from being ordinary, can be for us an extraordinary time – of *spiritual* growth! Ordinary Time can and ought to be a time when we *have* time to grow and mature in our Christian faith – without the pressures of Advent and Lent, Christmas and Easter.

The coming months of August and September offer each one of us a time quietly to explore and deepen our Christian faith – or maybe to *begin* our journey of Christian faith! It's a time to reinvigorate our prayer life, unite more deeply with God; a time to nourish and develop our personal spiritual journey.

Archdeacon Audrey (of Bodmin) suggests learning some prayers off by heart (and she asks: "Which ones do *you* know?").

Or perhaps you might try and pause for some 'Sabbath moments' during your day – times when you step out of the busy-ness of your life and simply re-connect with God.

Or maybe reading is more your thing? There are countless excellent Christian writers to guide and nurture you along your own journey of faith. I know who *my* favourites are (St Francis of Assisi, Henri Nouwen, Thomas Merton, John Stott, Nick Fawcett, Brother Lawrence) but I don't want to try and influence you!

Ordinary Time is *this* day, *this* moment. Ordinary Time is **NOW!**So let's make Ordinary Time a time when ordinary people like us grow in our faith and become the *extra*ordinary messengers of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

God bless you and may you grow in Jesus Christ.





# Latest News from Bolenowe Horse Sanctary Bonaventure Farm, Ruan Minor

'Open Sundays' are proving very popular, which is so encouraging because when we made the decision, some months ago, to open on Sundays we didn't really know what to expect as the Sanctuary has never been open to the public on a regular basis before (only by appointment). Our first 'Open Sunday' was on the 2<sup>nd</sup> of June and since then each one sees more visitors to the sanctuary than the one before. We have been pleased to see and meet many of the local residents who are fast becoming regulars for their Sunday afternoon tea, and we've had lots of visitors to the area too. Everyone is made welcome; there is no entry charge, just a donation box. This current spell of long awaited sunny weather is really helping, people are just dropping in to see the horses which is lovely and our Café and 'Cream Teas' are proving very popular too.

Over the last few weeks, we have seen an increase in the number of Adoptions too thanks to our Sunday visitors. Every adoption or donation will help us to see the horses through next Winter's feed, hay and vets bills. Also we would like to say a big 'thank you' to everyone in the Lizard area who have donated items to our Bolenowe Charity shop over the last few weeks. These generous donations have helped us to raise more money and has made it possible for us to go ahead with installing a water supply direct into the small paddocks. The pipes, connectors and automatic paddock drinkers have been ordered and so all we have to do next is to dig down and lay the pipes! Not an easy task!

Currently we are training up a small team of young volunteers as Bolenowe guides who will be pleased to show you around the Sanctuary and tell you lots of interesting things

## Gardening in August and September

by David Endean

What does anyone know, let alone the reactionist tabloid style headline writers? A few weeks ago we were going to have a decade of poor summers. Roll on a few weeks and this could be the hottest driest summer for many years, and we are being told how to combat the effects of drought and heat exhaustion, as this is a taste of things to come in future years with the effects of global warming starting to bite.

Did you have a wander around and look or should I nose in the gardens and allotments which have been opened to the public around the peninsula over the last few weeks? The weather really was kind and I hope plenty of money was raised for the various good causes. These are ideal events to get ideas for your own garden as you can see what works well near you. The conditions are most likely to be the same as yours, so if you get the opportunity and similar events occur, then make the most of them and have a proper good nose around.

The hot dry spell has started to affect the lawns, but please do not waste water on it. It may not look great but it will recover later with rain, whereas watering with a hose or sprinkler will only encourage shallow rooting. This is only viable for a putting or bowling green and, even then, if left to nature those games would be even more challenging. One of the worst examples of this I saw a few weeks ago when someone had a sprinkler going all day on the verge outside their property. 50% was wasted as some fell on the tarmac and ran down the road and more was directed into the hedge which was no more than an agricultural hedge comprising of blackthorn, rough grass and bramble. Then with it being throughout the heat of the day I would not like to hazard a guess as to how much just evaporated. Money to burn comes to mind. Save your water for more precious things. Established plants in the open ground should be fine, so concentrate on pots and containerised plants and things under cover. The water soon gets used up and you will find that your water butt will not last long, I advise when watering to use a watering can; this is harder work than a hose but you can see how much you are using and you will be far less wasteful if you have to work for it.

Back to the lawns. In the hot weather, the lawns will still benefit from mowing but raise the blades up a notch or two this serves several purposes. The higher blades means longer grass which will look greener, the longer grass will shade the soil so reduce water loss through evaporation, and it will also give more protection from wear in the well-trodden areas. But mowing will cut off the seed and flower heads and pick up debris and so provide a good finished effect.

I advise getting in some spring bulbs now even if they are not planted for a little while yet. Get them now while the stock is there, either by mail order or from the various garden centres. The spring show will be pleased to see a few more entries.

Hedges are growing well and, like most things in life, little and often is best and will keep it looking neat and compact. Down here, most hedges seem to grow

all year round but try to time it so that your last trimming of leylandii type hedges is somewhere around mid- September. This will give it some time to recover but also toughen up before the winter salt laden winds return to burn the foliage. Later trimming could well lead to the hedge burning.

In the vegetable garden, harvesting will now be well under way. Keep picking the beans of all types regularly so they remain young fresh and tender. The same goes for the salad crops. At this time of year with hot dry times these crops tend to bolt after a thunder storm. The extra moisture makes them think that it is now or never to reproduce and set seed. It is generally too late to sow lettuce seed now to mature outdoors but it is still worth sowing some seed to harvest as just young fresh leaves. With protection this can happen almost all year round. Back to sowing and planting: try out some winter brassicas. Things like spring greens can be sown either direct or in modules. In general, winter brassicas suffer fewer pest problems but pigeons seem to always be a problem. Netting your cabbages is the only real solution. You can probably still find some other brassica plants in the garden centres if you're quick, and you could sow some kohl Rabi and garden turnips.

Some other things that can be sown still are some quick maturing carrots, second cropping potatoes and baby beetroots.

Keep up the dead heading and later in September when the bedding is about spent look into clearing some space for some winter/ spring bedding. One of my favourites are Violas; I think that they are better than Winter Flowering Pansies as they flower quicker and although the flower size is much smaller they certainly have

With some good TLC they will last deep into next spring. Also plant out Wallflowers and Sweet Williams into their final positions later on in September.

What will I be doing over the next couple of months? Well my exploits with the sweet peas are over now, so work will be concentrated on the Dahlias and Chrysanthemums: both of these are well developed plants now but work on staking, thinning the number of shoots and carrying out a process called disbudding. This a process where flower buds are removed so that larger better shaped blooms are formed. For instance, those large bloom chrysanthemums get no more than three blooms and some varieties are only allowed to develop one flower.

Enjoy your gardening over the summer.

## **Cornwall Council Community Chest Grants**

Cornwall Council has announced that community projects are set to benefit from additional funding after members of Cornwall Council's Cabinet agreed to increase the Community Chest grant allocated to each Council Member to £3,000 for this year.

The aim of the grants is to benefit a wide range of people and activities, including vulnerable children or adults, young people, facilities for older people, community facilities, local environment projects, and community safety projects.

Groups and organisations can apply for one-off grants of between £100 and £1,000 which are designed to support specific projects rather than to contribute to an organisation's recurring running costs. The fund can also be used to attract 'match' funding from other sources.

During the life of the previous Council, grants from local Members helped hundreds of different organisations and projects. Examples include support for a community arts festival, providing electricity to a village green, providing outdoor play equipment, funding goal posts for a football club, a new cooker for a community kitchen, new musical instruments for local bands and orchestras and a new central heating system for a village hall.

Following this announcement, our local Councillor, Carolyn Rule has provided the following information:

"There is now a new system for the delivery of the community grants. The pot for each councillor is £3000 for 2013/14, reverting back to £2195 in subsequent years. There is no facility to carry forward any underspend, so anything not allocated in the appropriate financial year will be lost to the division. My preference is to offer smaller grants circa £250 so that I can assist a lot of our special organisations across the division and allow my small donation to be used for match funding to draw down other grant aid.

The first step for any grant application is to talk to the regeneration support officers to see in the first instance whether the project would meet the necessary criteria. Our contact officer is Kerri Gendall 01736 336865. Kerri will be able to have initial discussions and send out appropriate guidance notes to applicants; along with an application form should they wish to proceed. This will then be added to a spreadsheet kept at the office so that a record is kept of all applications and none get lost. Once the completed form is returned to this officer they will asses it and then pass it to me for my approval. I would be grateful as always to speak to any of you if you are thinking about lodging an application as early on in this process as possible.

## A Comment from Simon Sugrue

July 4th 2013

Ten years ago today I was in Kuwait. I was part of a team helping to recover the equipment used by the Army in the Second Iraq War. One of the ports we used there had been taken over by the Americans. The Security at the entrance to the place was very obvious and staffed entirely by US Soldiers. I always tried to maintain a friendly relationship with security because I was in and out of these places on a daily basis. Here it was necessary to leave the car, go into the guardhouse, sign in and sometimes be subjected to a bit of interrogation.

On this day, July 4<sup>th</sup>, I thought I'd make a point about US Independence Day. I said that it was good to see the 'old Colonial boys doing well'; this was greeted by puzzled looks from at least a dozen of the fifteen or so people there, all Americans. The small number of people who were either not puzzled or just not listening, made no comment. I followed this up with a comment about Independence Day and they confirmed that I had the date right. So I asked, tactfully, who they thought the US Independence had been gained from. The puzzled expressions remained, and eventually a couple of brave souls ventured that they had never thought about this

I left it at that but noticed that the quiet minority kept silent so, as I went out, I had a quiet word with one of these, possibly the Guard Commander, some sort of NCO. I asked him to find out how many people in there really did know who had been obliged to give USA its independence and tell me when I came back from the ship I was visiting.

I went back a couple of hours later and was told that just three out of the fifteen people actually knew that it was Great Britain that ceded Independence to USA. I was amazed at the level of ignorance and even more amazed when I realised that these people aspire to control the whole World. Worrying? I think so.

Revised plans were now available on the Cornwall Council planning website and the Parish Council had been assured by the planning officer that a planning condition could be incorporated into a planning consent to ensure the proposed development could not be made into a separate dwelling.

- **d.** Caerleon Cottage the planning consent stated the landscaping should have been complete before the development was occupied. The status of this is being checked by planning and the planning officer has contacted the contractor about the landscaping and is awaiting a report.

d. Insurance Policy – should this include the War Memorial? It was thought the Church doesn't insure it.

Clerk to investigate and to be added to the next Agenda.

**9. Matters arising from the Minutes:** Play Area – Mrs W Elliott had accepted the invitation to be a co-opted Member of the Play Area Committee. Play Area Committee Members to liaise with Mrs Elliott regarding meetings.

The Safety Inspection report had been circulated. – several items of potential concern had been identified. These are to be inspected by the Committee and a decision made as to whether a contractor needs to be instructed. Committee to liaise. A further estimate has been obtained from Taylor Designs but needs to be amended as some details are inaccurate. Starting to investigate grant sources for funding.

Mundys Field Car Park – concerns have been expressed the Car Park is being used as a transfer area.

Councillor Collins had met with contractors who had suggestions for improving the entrance to the car park to reduce wear and tear including the incorporation of a speed hump.



The granites are still in the Car Park and need to be moved to the Recreation Ground. Grass and weeds in the Car Park and be maintained as part of a trimming regime and no further action is required.

It had been suggested a line of trees be planted along the edge of the Car Park to improve visual amenity. There is a line of drains somewhere within the Car Park and their location needs to be confirmed to ensure any planting scheme does not interfere with them.
