Grade Ruan Community Trust Report

The Grade Ruan Community Trust undertook several projects during the 2017/18 financial year.

In partnership with the Tregothnan Estate, who were installing an electricity supply to their property at Kennack, electricity was connected to the toilets at Kennack. The Trust only had to contribute £850, with Tregothnan picking up the balance of the installation cost. Electric hand dryers can now be installed, thus reducing the paper waste produced at the site.

A fractured water pipe at Kennack had to be repaired at a cost of £654.00, although South West Water gave a rebate on the water bill in respect of leaked water.

Refurbishment of the Ladies toilets in Cadgwith was completed at a total cost of £13,093.79.

Grass cutting on the verge at the Treleague Crossroads cost £375.

The following grant support was provided:

- The Christmas Lights Committee
- Grade Ruan School Withie Workshop (Xmas Lanterns)
- Grade Ruan Under 5's
- Payments to Grade Ruan Parish Council, in respect of a 3 year undertaking to repay the loan taken out to complete the new Pavilion

As I write, the weather has finally decided to improve, so here's looking forward to a long hot Summer (maybe?).

RMFC have had a few home matches, and some away, they seem to have returned to their old form, winning most times and heading for possible promotion again. With a back-log of rained-off games there will be matches on some Wednesday evenings as well as the usual Saturday afternoons.

Tanya's yoga classes continue on Tuesday and Thursday evenings, and the "temporary" beginners classes on Monday evenings continue.

We are still hoping to make some arrangement to replace the fish & chips on Friday evenings, but in the interim Ruan Store are happy to deliver pizzas to the Pavilion provided they are ordered before they close at 7pm! After 7pm on Fridays, we are opening up for cards, darts board games and table-tennis - there's a few people come in for this, but we would always like to see more!

In the bar, we now stock draught Guinness - which is selling much faster than expected, so well worth having! I'm also planning to stop stocking Wolf Rock, and have Skinners' "Lushingtons" instead, which I'm sure will prove a popular Summer beer. We are also increasing the range of soft drinks and bottled mixers.

As I mentioned last week we are beginning to move forward with a few outstanding jobs around the Pavilion, we are working on the kitchen design again, getting quotations from suppliers and investigating a finance package that will allow us to complete the work without too much delay. We are also planning to extend the concreted patio area to give a solid footing for the first section of a marquee (incorporating solid anchor points to stop it blowing away!).

This can be used on it's own as an extension to the bar, or as a link to a bigger external marquee. We will also be getting a third store shed, to be sited between the 2 existing sheds, allowing us safe storage for spare furniture and the remaining items from the garage that we rent (at least the things that are worth keeping). This will mean we can get rid of the garage, saving about £45 a month in rent.

We have decided to reduce the quantity of non-recyclable disposable products we use. This means that for big events like the May Festival and Cadwith BBQs we won't be using disposable plastic glasses, but, instead we will be selling reusable plastic glasses for a one-time cost of £1 each. We will also be replacing plastic straws with paper and the plastic "bomb" glasses with a reusable alternative. We already use compostable dishes and wooden forks for the BBQs. Old glass bottles, etc, already goes to be recycled.

You will find details of our May Festival as a pull-out centre section to this magazine - please read it and come and join us! We have music for all tastes in the evenings and loads of fun activities planned for Sunday afternoon, with a more relaxing schedule for Monday.

We usually hold our AGM in June, so look out for the date and time in next month's magazine. We are always looking for more committee members. We would like to have someone to represent the School. But also, we getting a little thin on the ground as people move away from the village or their circumstances change! If you're interested in helping out you would be more than welcome, so please get in touch.

Gardening in May

by David Endean

Well this spring has been late and wetter than the sea apparently. Culdrose was in the top ten of wettest weather stations for March and we had more than double our average rainfall for the month but I really do not think that I needed to tell you that, as many of us are evolving webbed feet. The swallows are back and the rest of the birds are busy with their spring routines. The problem with the late spring is that it has compressed many jobs that need doing into a smaller time window you always feel rushed as those jobs need doing, nature is amazing it will invariably always catch up especially those weeds.

Anyway jobs to do this month? Beans more to the point Runner beans, a real favourite of many. This month is time enough to start to sow them, any earlier and they tend to go yellow and standstill if not die and the later sowings catch them up and pass them. My best advice is find a warm spot in full sun and dig a good trench and fill with some well-rotted organic material be it farm yard manure or garden compost. Add a little general fertiliser of your choice, back fill then erect your framework of bean stakes be it a row or wig wam then sow a couple of beans per station or plant a single plant if you have acquired some to get a head start, then get ready to act like Jack. The most important thing with runner beans is to pick them regularly at least twice a week. I think that it is the single most off putting factor to people about runner beans, eating some that are stringy with what seems like plastic in them.

Those of you growing potatoes keep earthing them up for a while yet, to be truthful I could write this whole column on jobs to do in the veg patch this month as really it is time to sow everything. Keep sowing lettuce and other salad crops I grow a lot of these in modules this is a little more time consuming but it does give you a head start over the weeds. I have a selection to plant out this month including cabbage, spring onions, beetroot and lettuce. This year I am also trying some Kallettes a quite fancy chefie veg which are a cross between Brussel Sprouts and Kale.

If you have not done so already it is now time to plant you tomato plants out in the greenhouse, I tend to wait a little while longer as I have too many other things in there as yet. Wait until the end of the month if you are planting outside. Either plant them in the greenhouse border or use a good quality grow bag, the more soil that they have to grow in the less the chance of them drying out is a possibility. I like to sink a large flower pot beside the plant which I water into to prevent run off.

In the flower borders tidy up the daffodil leaves and remove the weeds then get in there and put in some staking to support the plants as they grow instead of them flopping and covering over some other precious beauties that you have there. Canes and string are fine and some pea stick material is quite pleasant but why not invest in some proper fit for purpose plastic coated metal staking which can link together and blend in with the foliage, why spoil the job for an hapeth of tar! Any gaps that you have in your border, or most likely your pots and tubs as the month progresses, you can get on with planting out those half hardy bedding plants, French marigolds, Asters, Antirrhinums, Petunias,

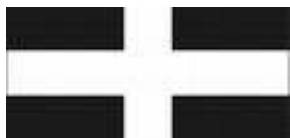

Ageratum, but most likely Begonias, Busy lizzies and Geraniums.

It is not too late to sow a few hardy annuals which will give you a later splash of colour either in a gap or two or as I would in a module tray and plant them out when a gap appears.

Lots of spring flowering shrubs will benefit from pruning this month Shrubs like flowering currants, Forsythias, Pieris, Kerrias and flowering quinces all want pruning right now just as flowering has ceased. First cut out dead and damaged branches then a few of the oldest stems but no more than a third of them then do some light shaping. This will invigorate the shrub but maintain flowering next year. But my best advice on Daphne is do not touch them at all as they are very temperamental and will die at a small change in circumstance. Another temperamental plant is the Ceanothus (Californian Lilac) trim just after flowering but only into green wood.

Well hopefully that will give you some idea as to what to do in your garden this month, do not forget to mow your lawn, my best advice is to get out there and enjoy your gardening.

NEWS FROM GRADE RUAN

COMMUNITY LAND TRUST

After three years of hard work, Grade Ruan Community Land Trust has now been granted Planning Permission to build six affordable homes for local people on the edge of Ruan Minor village just opposite the telephone exchange.

The Trust was formed initially to make sure that the money gained for affordable housing when the Kennack Hotel site was redeveloped was not lost to the parish and reallocated elsewhere. Its aim is to tackle the problem of providing quality affordable family homes in an area where local people are being priced out of the market.

The land will be purchased from the local farm at minimal cost, in line with Cornwall Council's guidelines for affordable housing. Nigel Green, from the farm, was one of the founding members of the Trust and is acutely aware of the need for affordable housing in an area dominated by second homes. Nigel says: "I'm delighted to have played a part in providing homes in perpetuity for local people and helping the future of the whole village community. There are a lot of holiday homes in the area and in Cadgwith half the properties are empty during the winter. People I've known all my life are being forced to move further and further away. This project will help families to be able to stay living locally."

The Head teacher at Grade Ruan School also welcomes the news of planning permission being granted. Wendy Sherlock says: "Affordable housing in the catchment area future-proofs the school and will undoubtedly have a positive effect. Our school is small and, with education budgets being cut, the only way we can attract proper funding is by having more pupils. Keeping our villages going keeps village schools open and provides a vibrant place to live and be educated in."

Paul Collins, Chairman of the Grade Ruan CLT, says: "We can at last see the way to a start of building later this year. It is a truly community-led project, run by locals for locals. It will be good to see part of the need for proper local housing being met." If anyone in the parish would like to lend or join the Board to get the job done, please ring Paul on 01326 290754.

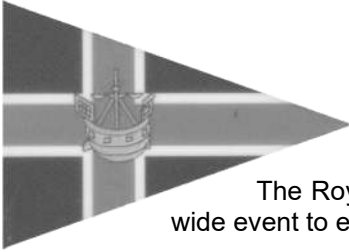

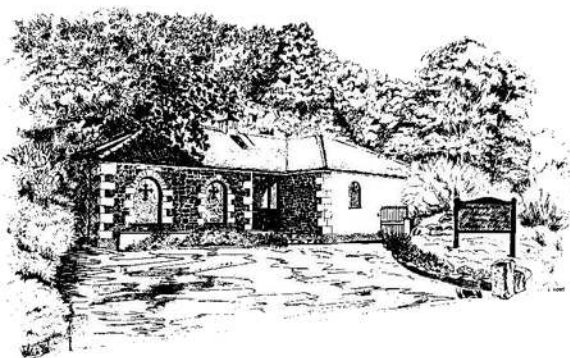

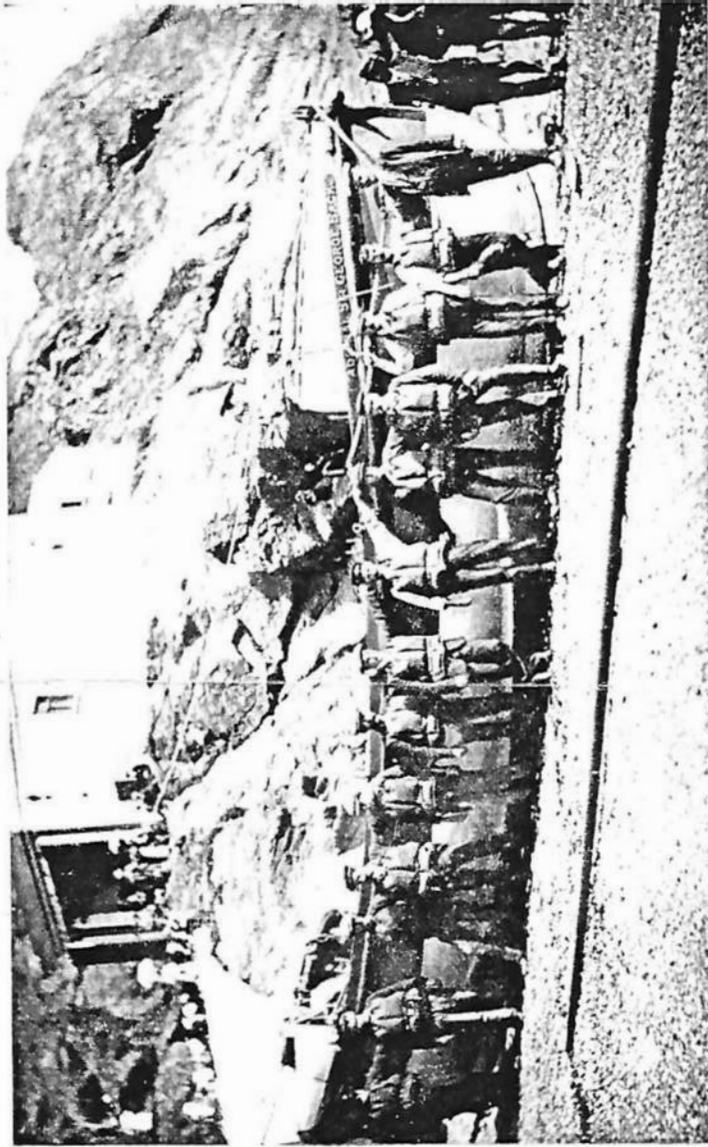
