

REFURBISHMENT OF GRADE CHURCH



The long-awaited refurbishment of Grade church is now in sight. The stimulus has been the statutory quinquennial inspection which was carried out by Scott & Co of Truro in December and described the maintenance and repairs required, many of which will be obvious to visitors. The existing roof has been repeatedly patched after winter gales have dislodged slates, so reroofing and replacing gulleys and gutters is a priority.

A steeplejack survey has shown that the tower isn't in such poor condition structurally as had been feared and that the large vertical crack on the south side is due to the loss of pointing. So repointing the tower is also a priority.

We are fortunate to have the advice of staff at Scott & Co who are very experienced in the maintenance of historic buildings and are drawing up specifications and seeking tenders from tradesmen. They will also apply for a Faculty - effectively planning permission from the church authorities to go ahead.

As soon as estimates are to hand, members of the Friends of St Ruan and St Grade Historic Church Buildings will begin writing grant applications and planning future fundraising events to pay for the work needed.

Julie and Mark Oldfield adopt Thora from Soi Dog Foundation



Julie and Mark Oldfield have rescued this Collie after visiting Soi Dog Foundation in Thailand last June.

They decided to adopt Thora, who was buried alive in a rubbish dump with her brother as a puppy. The foundation managed to save them but it has left Thora blind and with some brain damage.

They had originally chosen to adopt a German Shepherd, but sadly he died. Julie explained: "Whilst we were there helping with some of the dogs rescued from the meat trade and off the streets, we met Fanumpa. He had been hit by a car as a puppy on the dangerous Phuket streets, leaving him unable to use his hind legs. A fund was set up and a lovely couple who were visiting the shelter donated the money to buy him a wheelchair. After we went home I kept thinking about Fanumpa and received updates of how he was racing around in his new wheel chair. We decided to adopt him as we felt he would benefit from having his own home and lots of open spaces here in Cadgwith."

Sadly however, whilst preparing him for his flight, it was discovered that he was suffering from heart failure which meant that he couldn't fly anywhere. Julie and Mark were really disappointed as they had fallen in love with his cheeky character. Happily he was to be fostered locally in Thailand but he never made it to his foster home as he died shortly after.

They then came across Thora whose terrible story "just stole our hearts", said Julie. Her brother was adopted as a puppy and Thora has been waiting ever since. She flew over on the 21st March with five other lucky dogs, chaperoned by a flight volunteer.

The Soi Dog Foundation was set up by an English couple, John and Gill Dalley several years ago and it is now a world class animal hospital and shelter where many vets go to train.

THE LIZARD LIFEBOAT VISITOR CENTRE NEWS

The 100 or so miles of Cornish coastline and waters from Falmouth to Newlyn are served by three RNLI Lifeboat Stations; Falmouth, Lizard and Penlee. Each of these locations has its own range of different activities happening throughout the year and, therefore, each has its own allocation of lifeboats and crews to enable them to deliver the nature of support they could be called upon to provide at any time.

Falmouth Town Harbour has a myriad of boat traffic of all shapes and sizes using its waters on a daily basis and larger commercial and naval traffic carries with it additional issues. Penlee Lifeboat is based at Newlyn which provides a base for a significant fishing industry and with nearby Penzance Harbour and Mounts Bay leisure and recreation usage they are certainly kept busy. The waters around the Lizard provide ample opportunity for the 'local' inshore fishing fleet to ply its trade.

The Lizard Lifeboat is perfectly placed to support this activity and also to be available when needed to assist the leisure and recreation usage of the local waters and coastline which, whilst all year round (subject to weather conditions), is majorly from Easter to the end of October.

Over the years different classes of RNLI Lifeboats have been designed and built to satisfy different needs and conditions and, of course, to take on board technological development. The largest boat in the RNLI fleet is the 'Severn Class' and both Falmouth and Penlee, because of the type of duties they are called upon to perform, have one of these allocated as their Station ALB (All Weather Lifeboat). Both of these boats are moored afloat at their stations.

The second largest boat in the fleet is the 'Tamar Class' which was designed to provide similar operational facilities to the 'Severn Class' but with the addition, amongst other things, of protected propellers in order to enable slipway launching and work in shallow waters. Our own ALB, 'RNLB ROSE', is one of the 27 Tamar Class boats currently operating in the RNLI fleet.

In view of the high level of in-shore activity the stations are required to support, both the Falmouth and Penlee Stations are also allocated a fast response Atlantic 85 boat. The Atlantics are 8.44 metres rigid inflatables and have a top working speed of 35 knots. They operate with a crew of 4 and can carry a passenger load of 24 persons. For close contact work on the water, RNLB ROSE carries a 3metre 'Y-Boat' in a recessed chamber within its stern section. The Y-Boat has a crew of 2 and is powered by a 15hp 'Mariner' outboard engine.

Based on current advice, we have considered how we are going to run the Pavilion for the next month (or two...). Of course, there are new announcements from the Government daily - so some of this may be changed by the time this magazine is published!

We will continue to open the Bar on Friday evenings between 5 and 8pm for as long as there is a demand. Of course, if there is an escalation in Government advice to avoid pubs and clubs to a ban on opening, we will have to comply. Whilst we are open, we will take practical steps to reduce the risks to both volunteer staff and customers.

All other regular activities have now been cancelled by their organisers - the remaining football league matches, euchre, darts and yoga classes all cancelled.

We are cancelling all party bookings for April (fortunately there is only one), and will review the situation again before May. At the moment we are not cancelling the May Festival. but anticipate that to be a real possibility. We hope that by the Summer, the situation will have begun to improve, so we will continue to plan fund-raising including band bookings. events Cadqwith BBQs and the Carnival - but obviously we will keep this under review.

We have enough funds to (just-about) cover our fixed outgoings (gas, electricity, water, phone, insurance, etc.) for 2 to 3 months. If we have to close, we can switch off heating (we would be doing that soon anyway) and cooling systems - which will save money in the longer term, but the electricity is on a "budget" account with fixed monthly payment, and the gas usually gets refilled in the Summer (whether we want it or not!).

There are difficult times ahead, but I'm sure we'll pull through. There's plenty of businesses in a worse position than us, and many people with real fears for their health, even their lives. I wish you all the best of health and hope to see you all again soon, when it's all over.

On a more positive note, we have organised a work party (and a lorry-load of stone) to sort out the potholes in the driveway and parking area. This will have been done by the time you read this - with grateful thanks to Stephen Green (again!) for the loan of a digger.

Gardening in April

by David Endean

The world is a fast changing place these days and the way we go about our daily business is having to change because of this corona virus sweeping through our world. As I pen this article we have lost our Spring Flower Show for this year and are unsure what community events will take place over the coming months. But one constant is the garden this will be something that you can continue with if you are well enough, even if you are self-isolating or self-distancing, as you are unlikely to be in close proximity to many people in your own garden. But who knows in this ever changing world, see what is happening in France.

A group of shrubs that may need some pruning around now are those which flowered this spring, things like the flowering currants *Ribes spp* and *Forsythia*. These you cut out a third of the old wood once again when the shrub is mature and at the size you require if they are too big and over grown cut them back hard but you may lose the flower for one year but doing it now gives the most chance of flowers in twelve months' time. Also finish off the pruning of the Hydrangeas for the classic mop heads and lace caps just tidy up the old dead flower stalks and maybe remove a few of the very oldest branches with the aim of gradually rejuvenating the bush.

In your borders you will have already have done your weeding, but have you given the beds a generous dressing of a slow release fertiliser such as fish, blood and bone. Also putting a layer of mulch around now supresses any more weed and traps in the moisture from the winter rains.

While you are pottering in the borders now is a good time to start getting some staking in around your herbaceous plants, as the proverb says - a stitch in time saves nine. If you get the stakes in early they are quickly covered up and the plants do not flop, plants rarely look right if they are staked after they have flopped also they can collapse on other plants and in the worst cases kill them by smothering and blocking out the light.

Also whilst you have the fertiliser to hand give a generous dose to your daffodils of which most will have finished flowering now. I know the strappy leaves on these look untidy but do not do anything to them for at least six weeks even better to let them turn yellow and start to be eaten. Do not trim them back or tie them in knots as was done in times gone by. They need to be able to photosynthesise to put energy back into the bulb so that it will flower well next year.

Down in the veg patch there is much to do, sowing and planting comes on fast from now on. It is time to plant out your main crop potatoes, sow carrots and parsnips, and get the onion sets in. It has been such a long wet winter that I expect you are well

behind in this area of the garden. There is the saving grace that often the later sown crops will catch up, I have several things to plant out which I brought on in the greenhouse like lettuce cabbage and beetroot.

The greenhouse has loads of things to do but I expect you will be thinking about planting out tomato plants. This can generally be done from the middle of April without too much trouble. Prepare the ground well and if you are using pots or bags be very generous with the amount of compost you give them because they are hungry, thirsty plants and a good root run will reduce the effect of these problems.

In the greenhouse now is the right time to sow the quick growing half hardy annuals like French and African Marigolds and Asters. Also keep sowing hardy annuals in small pots or modules just to fill any gaps which may appear in your garden. April is generally a mad month for pricking out seedlings which you sowed in March this needs to be done to get good strong stocky plants. You use compost with more nutrients and give the plant more space.

With your lawns you should be able to start thinking about lowering the blades on the mower and now they are actively growing away you can decide whether you wish to use a weed and feed product of your choice. Looking around after such wet times moss seems a problem this year so something to kill the moss and then scarify the lawn to remove it may well be a necessity. This needs to be done to stop the grass from being stifled.

I am off to get the sweet peas planted out, keep well and enjoy your gardening.

Key questions were: is the fishing industry at risk if the cellars are sold?; if so, what should be done about it by the fishing community and by the Parish Council? The Council has discussed in private sessions of Council meetings (due to the confidential nature of valuations, personal data and so on), and has commissioned, received and analysed structural surveys for all three buildings (Fort York, Steamers and the Winch House) and valuations for two buildings (Fort York and the Winch House). The working group (Cllrs Freeman and Green) have been undertaking discussions with representatives of the fishing industry and current building owners. This is the first time the Council has formally discussed the matter in the public session of a Council meeting and this may form part of a series of public consultations used to ascertain the most desirable course of action. **DISCUSSED** as above including the following points:

- Listed status and covenant of Winch House Is there a threat that use by the fishing industry can be removed, and if not, why the need for the Council to investigate purchasing?
- Identifying if the buildings are for sale, and the level of negotiation the Council has had with current owners.
- Cold Store: could the Council purchase and secure this separately?
- Should the Council consider all three buildings together, or prioritise one over the others?
- Suggestion of putting a covenant on Fort York (for use by fishing industry). Is the same for Steamers desirable?
- Would fishing really stop if ownership of buildings changed from one private landlord to another?
- Time limits, pressure on the Council to purchase.
- Grants what may be on offer for purchasing, and what may be on offer for refurbishing after purchasing.
- Public Works Loans to fund purchasing potential impact on the precept and Council budgets.
- Management and maintenance matters the Council could conceivably purchase buildings but not manage them. Would an existing or new Trust do this? Parallels with the Community Trust and public toilets and car parks
- The Council would seek to ensure it has general public support before taking any course of action.
- Liabilities, renovations, administration and finance if the Council were to purchase
- If direct purchase doesn't proceed, how best can the Council facilitate?

Confidential matters were discussed in the later private session of the meeting. The item will return to the normal Council meeting agenda on 9th March and further public consultation will be considered.
